

WHY TELEHEALTH MATTERS

REGIONAL VETERAN CONSIDERATIONS

- •Nebraska: 62% rural | 39 min avg. travel | 10% broadband gap
 - •10% home telehealth use
- •North Dakota: 58% rural | 32 min | 28% broadband gap
 - 3% telehealth use
- •South Dakota: 54% rural | 33 min | 22% broadband gap •7% telehealth use



TRENDS IN RURAL NEBRASKA

Adoption

- •90.5% report internet access, but only 20.8% have used telehealth
- •Most adoption: emergency care augmentation, mental health, neurology
- •Greatest opportunities: remote patient monitoring, bio-wearables, chronic disease support

Hospital Success

- •Chase County Hospital uses telehealth to replace months of backup physician coverage
- •Gains access to pediatrics, neurology, cardiology



TELEHEALTH POLICY CHALLENGES



Bipartisan Policy Center Report:

- •Recommend preserving Medicare flexibilities
- •Caution: ensure local care is not displaced by virtual-only mega-providers
