## **Advanced Practice Registered Nurse**

- \* **NOT YET EFFECTIVE.** The APRN Compact will go into effect once 7 states enact it by law. Two states have so far enacted the Compact. \*
  - The compact allows an advanced practice registered nurse to hold one multistate license with a privilege to practice in other compact states.

#### **Audiology/Speech Language Pathology**

- \*\* **NOT YET EFFECTIVE.** The ASLP-IC Commission is scheduled to convene in January 2022 to establish rules and bylaws to implement the compact. This process can last a year or longer, meaning the Commission could begin issuing privileges to practice in compact member states by late 2022 or early 2023. \*\*
  - Once the Compact is fully operational, licensed audiologists and speech-language pathologists will be able to apply for a privilege to practice in-person and through telehealth in ASLP-IC states.

#### Counseling

 Professional counselors who meet uniform licensure requirements are able to quickly obtain a privilege to practice, which is equivalent to a license to practice counseling in another state.

## **Emergency Medical Services (IA, NE, ND, SD)**

- The EMS Compact is <u>not</u> a form of EMS licensure reciprocity. The EMS Compact extends a privilege for EMS personnel from member states to practice on a short-term, intermittent basis under approved circumstances in other member states.
  - Examples of such short-term, intermittent practice may include:
    - Response areas for EMS personnel that cross state lines;
    - Staffing for large scale responses that are not at the level of a governor's declaration of a disaster, including details in support of federal agencies examples including wild-land firefighting teams, homeland security;
    - Staffing for large-scale planned special events such as concerts and sporting events.

## Medical (IA, NE, MN, ND, SD, WI)

• The Interstate Medical Licensure Compact offers a voluntary, expedited pathway to licensure for physicians who qualify.

## Nurse (enhanced) (IA, NE, ND, SD, WI)

• Under the eNLC, nurses can practice in other NLC states, without having to obtain additional licenses.

#### Occupational Therapy (IA-pending, NE-pending, WI-pending)

- \*\* **NOT YET EFFECTIVE.** The OT Compact Commission will convene for the first time in August 2022. The Commission will adopt initial bylaws and rules to carry out the Compact. This activation process generally takes up to a year or longer. \*\*
  - Under the OT Compact, Occupational Therapists (OTs) and Occupational Therapy
     Assistants (OTAs) who are licensed in good standing in a Compact member state may
     practice in other Compact member states via a "compact privilege," which is equivalent
     to a license.

## **Physical Therapy** (IA, NE, ND, SD, WI)

PT and PTA licensees who meet all eligibility requirements can purchase a Compact
Privilege in a Compact member state and, in most cases, start practicing physical therapy
in the other state almost immediately. The PT Compact's online system makes the
process of purchasing and renewing a Compact Privilege in other states simple.

#### Psychology (NE, MN-pending, IA-pending)

- To practice temporary, in-person face-to-face psychology under the authority of PSYPACT, providers will need to apply for and obtain an Interjurisdictional Practice Certificate (IPC) from the Association of State and Provincial Psychology Boards (ASPPB) and apply for and obtain a Temporary Authorization to Practice (TAP) from the PSYPACT Commission.
- In order to practice telepsychology in PSYPACT states, psychologists licensed in PSYPACT states only can apply to the PSYPACT Commission for an Authority to Practice Interjurisdictional Telepsychology (APIT). One required component of this authority granted by the PSYPACT Commission is that psychologists must obtain an E.Passport Certificate from ASPPB.
